Businesswoman, wife, mother of five, founder and President of Proclaiming Justice To the Nations, Laurie Cardoza Moore is a leader who successfully stewards masses toward her intended outcomes. An accomplished veteran of the many facets of "media" Laurie has been part of over 500 film and video productions as on-screen talent and producer.

With over twenty years experience in private enterprise, grassroots mobilization and community leadership, Laurie is an accomplished advocate who has represented issues related to families, women, children, faith and country. Based in Nashville, Tennessee, Laurie's career faced a turning point on 9/11 when she decided to focus her media and lobbying expertise on American security and Israel.

By 2002 Laurie was recognized as the "force of nature" that secured passage of HJR 960, a Resolution to support the State of Israel in the Tennessee General Assembly. In 2003, Laurie was also responsible for bringing Israeli dignitaries to Nashville to educate the Nashville Community of the plight of Israel's struggle to exist under the constant threat of terrorism.

Laurie has active ties to the Christian and Jewish communities, and has exceptional experience in building Jewish-Christian religious and political coalitions in support of Israel. In 2004 Laurie was awarded the "Friend of Israel Award" by The Center For Jewish Awareness and the "Goodwill Ambassador to Israel Award" by Israel's Consul General in Atlanta as she continued to work actively building relationships with decision makers across America.

In order to harness the momentum of Laurie's outreach on behalf of Israel, in 2005, Laurie established Proclaiming Justice To the Nations, Inc. (PJTN). PJTN's mission is to increase awareness and action by educating Christians about their Biblical responsibility to stand with their Jewish brethren and the State of Israel.

In 2006, Laurie co-produced "Lest We Forget," a documentary short that was a featured selection at the Liberty Film Festival in Los Angeles. The film focuses on the history of Islamofacism and the war that the US and Israel wage against it today. In 2007, Laurie co-produced the music video, "The Forgotten People," which screened at the 11th Annual Hollywood Film Festival. It is a cry from the grave as six million Jews remind us to never forget the horrors of the holocaust and warn of the new one on the horizon. In 2007, Laurie produced PJTN's first feature-length documentary that traces the roots of anti-Semitism and rise of a "new" anti-Semitism that is a coalition of the far right, the left, and radical Islam. These PJTN film productions serve as Laurie's primary engagement tools when she meets with decision makers at congregations and community events.

Yet the best is yet to come with Laurie's rising star. Her leadership and media expertise converge to create the most potent opportunity ever in the Christian world on behalf of Israel; Laurie secured PJTN as host of the National Religious Broadcasters Convention 'Prayer Dinner for Israel' until 2016. This convention is the single most important meeting reaching over 6,000 global Christian Broadcasters every year. Laurie and PJTN have the capacity to reach more "multipliers" on behalf of Israel than any existing pro-Israel initiative (including the Israeli government.)

Currently, Laurie is working hard to ensure that PJTN carries its pro-Israel message to more people across Christendom and around the world.
